**Lenten Prayer** is an anthem for Lent or Holy Week. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Ezekiel 37:1-4, Psalm 130, John 11:1-45, and Romans 8:6-11. One basic homiletical theme is the promise of redemption for all sinners through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Introduce this plaintive Lenten anthem by rehearsing mm. 5-11 on the neutral syllable "noo," striving for uniform timbre in each part. Special care should be given the call-and-response found in mm. 6-10. Each descending eighth note motive should begin strongly but fall away dynamically so that the responding voice may be clearly heard. However, the entire passage should build in strength from mezzo piano to mezzo forte. The three-note motive found in the men's voices on the words "My Savior" in mm. 16-17 is a good example of a standard baroque expression known as the "cry" motive. The first note is the anacrusis or "pick-up" note and should be sung softly, leading to the second note, which is the strongest of the three, then falling away to the third note.

Lenten Prayer is adapted from Pergolesi's Salve Regina. Scored originally for female and male soloists with string and continuo accompaniment, this arrangement for S.A.T.B. voices includes a new four measure introduction and a keyboard reduction of the vocal and instrumental parts. Tempo and dynamic indications and English words have also been added. An arrangement of this chorus for two part mixed voices is also available, No. 11468.

Giovanni Battista Pergolesi was an Italian who composed numerous instrumental and vocal works in the Baroque style. He is especially revered today for his very successful comic operas. However, many of his sacred choral works are also highly regarded for their expressiveness and melodic charm.

Patrick M. Liebergen is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin (Stout) and Director of the Chancel Choir at United Methodist Church, Menomonie, Wisconsin. With music degrees from St. Norbert College in DePere, Wisconsin, the University of Wisconsin (Madison), and the University of Colorado (Boulder), Dr. Liebergen frequently appears throughout the country as an adjudicator and clinician. His choral editions, arrangements and original works are widely published. Dr. Liebergen was the 1988 winner of the Wisconsin Choral Directors Association Competition and the 1990 Winner of the Anthem Contest sponsored by the Twin Cities Church Musicians Association.
