Dvorák’s symphony in E Minor, op. 95 (“From the New World”), is more commonly known as Symphony No. 9, rather than Symphony No. 5. Originally, Dvorák and his publishers assigned numbers to his symphonies according to the date of publication, as opposed to the date of composition. His first four symphonies were published posthumously, which led to all nine being renumbered after this arrangement was published.

PROGRAM NOTES

During Dvorak's stay in America, he was greatly impressed by the music of the American Negro and decided to utilize its style and mannerisms in music of his own creation. In Spillville, Iowa, where there was a colony of Czechs, he worked on the sketches of his Symphony in E Minor and it was completed in 1893. The first performance was given by the New York Philharmonic. The composer called his symphony: "Symphony from the New World".

Dvorak did not actually incorporate Spirituals or other Negro folk tunes into his symphony. He modeled his own thematic material after the idiom of the Negro song, and did this with such authenticity and skill that we are sometimes inclined to think that his own melodies are of American origin. The symphony has many interesting effects particularly when music Negroid in character is blended with Bohemian phrases and mannerisms. The last movement is vital, imaginative, and alive. It reflects Negroid music in its spirit, temperament, and energy - expressions of American life as Dvorak saw it.
