Gethsemane is a Lenten anthem that is especially appropriate for Maundy Thursday. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include any of the accounts of Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26: 36-46, Mark 14: 32-42, and Luke 22: 39-46) as well as Exodus 12: 1-4, Psalm 116: 12-18, John 13: 1-15, and 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26. One basic homiletical theme is the Suffering Savior who, through the power of prayer and death on the cross, brings salvation to us all.

The beautiful poetry of this highly expressive anthem demands sensitive text declamation. Guard against singing syllable-for-syllable and note-for-note. First, sing the melody in mm. 7-24 in unison on a liquid neutral syllable such as "noo," striving for a beautifully shaped legato. Next, speak the text, listening carefully for the natural word stresses. Then, sing the text with attful articulation while maintaining fluid phrasing.
