He is Alive! (Fanfare for Easter) is a resurrection anthem that may also be appropriate as a worship introit or as a triumphant choral introduction to standard Easter hymns, such as "Christ the Lord is Risen Today," "Christ Is Alive," "The Day of Resurrection" and "Jesus Christ Is Risen Today." Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalm 118: 14-24, John 20: 1-18, Acts 10: 34-43 and 1 Corinthians 15: 1-11. One basic homiletical theme is proclaiming the triumphant news of the resurrection: Jesus is risen, as He had promised!

In rehearsal, strive for a bright, articulate choral sound that will properly balance the keyboard and trumpets. Larger choirs may wish to divide into two parts, with Choir I singing the opening proclamation (mm. 1-16) from the back of the sanctuary, Choir II singing mm. 17-35 from the loft, and all singers joining for the closing proclamation (mm. 37-end).
