Feed Me, Lord is a communion anthem that is an inspired pairing of two transcendent melodies, Amazing Grace and the haunting theme from the Largo movement of Dvorák's Symphony from the New World. It may be especially appropriate for performance during Holy Week. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include 2 Samuel 18: 24-33, Psalm 102: 1-12, John 6: 47-57 and Ephesians 5: 15-20. One basic homiletical theme is the Lamb of God through whose death we find eternal life.

In rehearsal, strive for very legato phrases embued with a strong sense of the underlying eighth note pulse. Carefully shape each phrase dynamically guided by its natural contour. The C-Instrument part may be especially appropriate for oboe.

Patrick M. Liebergen is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin (Stout). With music degrees from St. Norbert College in DePere, Wisconsin, the University of Wisconsin (Madison), and the University of Colorado (Boulder), he frequently appears throughout the country as an adjudicator and clinician. Dr. Liebergen has received choral composition awards from the Twin Cities Church Musicians' Association and the Wisconsin Choral Directors' Association, and his works are widely published and performed.
