

Use finger 1 to press the 2nd string at the 1st fret. Strum strings 3–2–1.










Strumming

Listen to the song on your CD to hear how it should sound!





This double bar line tells us the music is finished.

Double dots on the inside of a double bar line mean to go back to the beginning and play again.







