
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
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Pitch

Music is written on a group of five lines, called a staff. It looks like this.




You can tell how high or low a note is by where it is on the staff.




The notes are given letter names, using the first seven letters of the alphabet. A B C D E F ${\sf G}$

Treble Clef


This is a **treble clef.** Here it is on a staff.



When there is a treble clef on the staff, the names of the notes are:



You can remember the names of the treble clef notes on the lines with this saying: <u>Every Good Boy Does Fine</u>



The notes that are in the spaces of the treble clef spell the word **FACE**.



Some of the instruments that play music written in the treble clef are: Flute, violin, guitar, clarinet and piano (right hand).
