The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the fellowship of the blood of Christ?

The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the fellowship of the body of Christ?

See the Bread, See the Wine is an anthem that may be sung during communion services and on Maundy Thursday. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Matthew 26: 26-29, Mark 14: 22-25, Luke 22: 17-20, John 6: 35-38 and 1 Corinthians 10: 14-22 & 11: 17-34. One basic homiletical theme is gathering in the presence of Christ at His table, remembering His sacrifice, and giving thanks for our salvation.

In rehearsal, strive for a flowing legato imbued with a strong sense of the underlying eighth note pulse. The opening section (mm. 4-12) may be sung as a duet. The traditional hymn Here, 3 My Lord, I See Thee, appears in mm. 21-36. It may be sung a cappella or accompanied and may be used separately as a prayer response.
