How Beautiful is an inspired choral meditation that weds the revered traditional hymn, *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*, with Twila Paris' beloved new song, *How Beautiful*. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Isaiah 52:7, Nahum 1:15, Matthew 26:26-30, Romans 10:14-21, 1 Corinthians 11:23-34, Galations 6:14 and Philippians 3:7.

In worship, mm. 1-37 may be excerpted and performed as a worship response to be sung by the choir or, with slight adaptation, by two soloists. Congregational singing is highly recommended on the final verse. A reproducible part for congregation may be found on page 12.
