**How Beautiful** is an inspired choral meditation that weds the revered traditional hymn, *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*, with Twila Paris' beloved new song, *How Beautiful*. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Isaiah 52:7, Nahum 1:15, Matthew 26:26-30, Romans 10:14-21, 1 Corinthians 11:23-34, Galatians 6:14 and Philippians 3:7.

In worship, mm. 1-37 may be excerpted and performed as a worship response to be sung by the choir or, with slight adaptation, by two soloists. Congregational singing is highly recommended on the final verse. A reproducible part for congregation may be found on page 12.

**Benjamin Harlan** serves on the faculty of the School of Church Music at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas, where he was formerly Dean. With degrees from Baylor University and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Dr. Harlan is a widely celebrated church choral composer, arranger and clinician.
