

The River is an inspired pairing of the two traditional tunes, *Shall We Gather at the River* and *Deep River*. Featuring a solo for low male or female voice, this arrangement is appropriate for both school and church choirs, for concert and for worship.

In rehearsal, strive for a lyrical legato imbued with a strong sense of the underlying eighth note pulse. Sing the rich harmonies on a neutral syllable such as “noo” until proper intonation and blend are achieved.

When performed by church choirs in worship, **The River** is especially appropriate for All Saints’, Lent, funeral and memorial services. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalm 46: 4, Isaiah 60: 12, Ezekiel 44: 1-12 and Revelation 22: 1-5. One basic homiletical theme is the journey of the faithful across the Jordan River to the Promised Land.

Greg Gilpin is a widely published choral composer and arranger with a degree in vocal music education from Northwest Missouri State University. Frequently in demand as a choral clinician and choreographer, he also is involved in the gospel music industry as a songwriter and singer, working with artists such as Bill and Gloria Gaither, Ray Boltz and Sandi Patty.
