John 17: 20-22

(Jesus lifted His eyes to heaven and spoke these words to God:)

"I pray for all believers, that they will be one,
as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You;
that they also may be one in Us,
that the world may believe that You sent Me.
And the glory which You gave Me I have given them,
that they may be one just as We are one."

One Song is a powerful general anthem that may be especially appropriate for services of discipleship, ecumenism, mission, stewardship and unity, as well as Trinity Sunday. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include John 17, 9-26, 1 Corinthians 1: 10-13 & 12: 12-31, Ephesians 4: 11-16 and Galatians 5: 20. One basic homiletical theme is the unity of believers with one another through their unity in Christ.

The highly expressive anthem should be performed with some freedom of movement and a gentle feeling of one pulse per measure. For a compelling choral response or worship benediction, perform mm. 93-118
