The Heavens Proclaim is a majestic choral masterwork by Baroque master Benedetto Marcello, arranged in this edition by Hal H. Hopson. The arranger has provided texts for both Easter and general worship, especially Ascension. For general occasions, suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalm 19, from which Hopson has adapted the text, and Hebrews 1: 1-12, for Easter, Psalm 72 and Romans 4: 13-25 & 6: 1-11. One basic homiletical theme is proclaiming the majesty of the Creator God, and the Redeemer God, Jesus Christ, who is the Lord of Life.

Both S.A.T.B. and S.A.B. editions of **The Heavens Proclaim** are available. As a special feature, Hopson has provided for smaller choirs an optional solo trumpet obbligato, and for larger choirs an optional brass accompaniment consisting of 2 trumpets, 2 trombones, tuba and optional French horn (available separately with full director's score, No. 20969).

Benedetto Marcello was born in Venice on August 9, 1686, and died in Brescia on July 24, 1739. As a young man, he followed his father into the law profession. However, after publishing both songs and sonnets, he turned to music as his primary profession. In 1724 he gained international fame through the publication of his *Paraphrase of the Psalms*. He went on to become one of the most important composers of his time, writing concertos, sinfonias, sonatas, stage works, oratorios and over 400 cantatas.

Hal H. Hopson is a widely celebrated church composer, arranger and musician. He earned degrees from Baylor University and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and has served on the church music faculties of Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey, and Scarritt Graduate School in Nashville. Especially celebrated for his arrangements and editions of sacred masterworks, Hopson has over 1,400 publications to his credit.
