NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

HARRY POTTER AND THE GOBLET OF FIRE is the fourth installment of the wildly popular Harry Potter Series. Please note that all metronome markings are just suggested tempi - feel free to adjust the tempo as needed. If desired, the opening sections in 3/4 time may be conducted in one.

Although the Mallet Percussion part calls for Chimes, Bells and Xylophone, all parts may be played on the just the Bells. The Timpani part is written for two (26" and 29") drums. If four Timpani are available, tune as follows, from the largest drum up: F, G, B \flat , D. This setup will require only a change of the the 26" drum to the C, and back to the B \flat .

The Alto Sax solo beginning at measure 74 should be played in a relaxed, schmaltzy style.

The crescendo in bars 136-137, and again in 140 should be a controlled, steady increase in volume. Remember, never play louder than your best sound.

I hope you and your ensemble find SELECTIONS FROM HARRY POTTER AND THE GOBLET OF FIRE to be a fun and worthwhile musical experience!
