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THE NIGHTINGALE

(The Emperor's palace. Narrators 1 and 2 enter and take their places downstage right and left, where they will remain for the entire show. The Gongkeeper ceremoniously enters, takes his place at the Chinese gong, and strikes the gong one time – a signal to begin. He remains in position until just before song #9. During Narrator 1's first line, the Emperor enters and sits cross-legged upon his throne. When the music begins, the Citizens of China enter. They fill the stage and sing directly to the audience.)




