NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This vocal chart can be characterized as a torch-style ballad, in which the rhythm section and the horns feel the groove as a constant $\frac{12}{8}$, played relaxed, laid-back, and a little "greasy." All eighth notes need to be played with a triplet feel unless specifically marked otherwise.

The piano vamp in the introduction can be repeated as needed. Notice that the bass is optional until m. 20. Various horn lines behind the vocal lead should stay dynamically under the vocalist. For example, the saxes at m. 13 should be very soft, so that the emphasis will stay on the duet between the vocalist and pianist. Measure 73 can be opened for additional repeats as needed. However, if repeated, it should be played an odd number of times to keep the phrash of leeling natural. The vocalist can scat, and the pianist can improvise, if desired.

With ensemble parts, the tendency is to rush triplets, so remind players to relax and hold the tempo steady. Quarter notes with a *marcato*, or rooftop (**A**), accent should be detached, relaxed, and played for their full value and then some—think "daht." *Staccato* notes are short, but not too short or clipped. The drummer and bass player should lock in the 12/8 feel—listen and play together.

There are also optional instrumental solo parts included to allow the chart to feature an instrumentalist instead of a vocalist.
