Come Follow Me is a general anthem that is especially appropriate for Lent and for services focusing on stewardship and evangelism. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalm 34, Matthew 4: 18-22, Mark 1: 16-20, and 2 Corinthians 5: 11-21. One basic homiletical theme is Ambassadors for Jesus.

The singers should speak the text in rehearsal, listening carefully for the natural word stresses and applying them in song within a fluid legato. To achieve better pitch and rhythmic accuracy, avoid singing too heavily or with a rapid vibrato. Prepare the singers for the measures with repeated pitches (m. 4-6, 24-25, etc.) by instructing them to think each successive repetition as being slightly thigher" than the previous. This thought process will help to avert poor intonation in such passages.
