

**Come Rejoicing, Sing!** is a joyful call to purpose for choirs of any size. A rhythmic opening subject delivers a pattern that proclaims a message of worship and adoration. Crisp articulations and gentle syncopations provide a percussive effect that will enliven your worship gathering. The inclusion of the optional claves and maracas offer directors an opportunity to present something truly fresh in their sacred programming. Easy to learn but hard to forget, this brief but effective anthem of praise is sure to be a favorite.

He is recognized throughout the United States for his many choral compositions, both sacred and secular. Over 1,200 compositions are currently in print, and the list continues to grow.
