PROGRAM NOTES

Unlike his *First Suite for Military Band*, which is based on original material, Gustav Holst's *Second Suite for Military Band* is based on British folk songs. The second melody in the first movement (March) is "Swansea Town," a song from the county of Hampshire in southern England. The tune is a sea shanty, which sailors sang while working on the ships.

Although written over 100 years ago, Gustav Holst's two suites for band are still performed countless times worldwide, and are widely considered two of the most important works ever written in the concert band genre.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This arrangement of "Swansea Town" is based on the first movement of Gustav Holst's Second Suite for Military Band. It is written for first-year students in their second semester of band. The suspended cynibal crash in the last measure may be played on crash cymbals if desired. Either way, the cymbals should be dampened on beat 3.

I hope you and your students enjoy the piece and that it serves as a worthy introduction to one of the greatest works written for band.
