## Tunbridge Meadows

*Tunbridge Meadows* is an expressive, lyric evocation of the English countryside. The introductory theme, in the clarinets, should be unhurried and allowed to "sing" over the ensemble. The *legato* quarter notes in measure 2, and elsewhere, should be stretched as much as possible without adding time to the measure.

At measure 17, the *allegro* eighth notes should be crisp, with no hint rushing. The *allegro* main theme should be bold, in the style of an English sea chantey.

The coda should be presented in a reflective, restful manner. If the oboe sound is too penetrating in the final chord, try letting the oboe play the  $B_{\downarrow}$  with the flutes.
