NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

The music of Percy Grainger has become some of the most beloved in the band repertoire. Band conductors all over the world cherish his music, especially his folk-song settings. He used the British folk song as his vehicle to express a great sense of harmonic beauty and rich orchestral techniques. Grainger would often take a folk song and set it for almost every possible combination of instruments and voices. Unfortunately, however, he never set his version of "The Sussex Mummers' Christmas Carol" for wind band.

There are two different settings of this carol that are penned by Grainger: one for piano and another cello (or violin) and piano. As a band conductor myself, I have often been dissatisfied by the only other available band version that is based upon the piano version. I have chosen to use the cello (or violin) and piano version as the basis of this setting for band. This version, I believe, contains much more of the musical passion for which Grainger is best known. This lush carol is a natural for the wind band. My intention in bringing this new band version to fruition is to give band lovers another opportunity to enjoy the great music of Percy Grainger. I have tried to emulate the scoring of Grainger as much as possible, and the rhythmic notation has been elongated to allow more flexibility in interpreting each musical phrase. The piece will work at a variety of different tempi, and you should feel free to express each phrase in a different way.

Grainger was a great lover of full choirs of instruments, and he was especially fond of the saxophone family. I have included a part for the entire saxophone family. The bass saxophone part is optional, but it is an instrument that has the potential to add wondrous bass sounds to the woodwind section. It is my hope to encourage its use in more wind bands by including it here.

The original setting of "The Sussex Mummers' Christmas Carol" was complete in 1911 (plano version) and the cello (or violin) and piano version was completed in 1916. The program notes in both scores read as follows:

This tune was notated by Miss Lucy E. Broadwood at Lyne, near Horsham (Sussex), in 1880 and 1881 from the singing of , ge, Christmas Mummers called "Tipteers or Tipteerers" during their play of St. George, the Turk, and the seven champions of Christendom. The words sung to the carol contain, among others, the following verses:

O mortal man, remember well When Christ our Lord was born; He was crucified betwixt two thieves, And crowned with the thorn.

O mortal man, remember well When Christ died on the rood: It was for we and our wickedness Christ shed His precious blood. God bless the mistress of this house With a gold chain round her breast; It's whether she sleeps, or whether she wakes, Lord send her soul to rest.

God bless the master of this house With happiness beside; It's whether he walks, or whether he rides, Lord Jesus be his guide.

God bless your house, your children too, Your cattle and your store; The Lord increase you day by day, And send you more and more.
