Because of its strategic location as the gateway to the Continent, Dover, England, has enjoyed an honored and vital history dating back to the third century. From the I588 defeat of the Spanish Armada through two World Wars, the port served as an important military installation.

DOVER PATROL MARCH recalls the valor and tenacity of the allied Bitish and American naval forces stationed at Dover druing World War I. The Dover Patrol, as they were called, ensured the safety of some I2 million soldiers as the traveled through the Straits of Dover to battle sites beyond. More then I25,000 ships were ushered unharmed through a maze of German submarines and mines. A monument honoring the Dover Patrol stands at St. Margaret's Bay along the picturesque white cliffs.
