PROGRAM NOTES

John Philip Sousa was born in Washington D.C., November 6, 1854, and began studying music at the age of six. He published his first piece at the age of 18 and became the leader of the U.S. Marine Band when he was only 26. In 1892, Sousa resigned from the military to organize his own civilian concert band. He composed the march "El Capitan" in 1896 using music extracted from his popular operetta of the same name.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

The cymbal part may be played with hand (crash) cymbals or with a suspended cymbal and a snare drum stick.
