PROGRAM NOTES

In 1893, after a memorable trip to the top of Colorado's Pikes Peak, college instructor Katherine Lee Bates wrote the words to the song "America, the Beautiful" as a poem. Oddly enough, the music that is associated with the poem was composed II years earlier by Samuel A. Ward. It wasn't until 1910 that Bates' words and Ward's music were published together, creating perhaps the most stirring patriotic song in American history.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

The chimes, timpani, and piano/keyboard parts are completely optional. If chimes are unavailable, you may substitute bells or omit the part altogether. Please feel free to raise the bells part 8va if desired. Horns and alto saxophones will need a full breath of air before the anacrusis to measure 38.
