Two Appalachian Songs contains a pair of American folk songs in contrasting styles and settings. Due to the fact that there is only one part per instrument, care should be given to ensure a proper balance-especially the clarinet melody at measure 5 in the lyrical "Once I Had a Sweetheart."

As always, the suggested metronome markings are merely a guide-feel free to adjust the tempo as needed.

Adherence to the numerous written articulations in "Cindy" is necessary for a musical performance. Even though there are a number of accented notes, a light style should be maintained throughout.
